



Never purchase a bull merely because his sire performed well in the show ring. Rather concentrate on the bull's own performance, as well as that of his dam. There is much truth in the saying that "GREAT STUD BULLS HAVE GREAT DAMS . . ."

In this respect the long-term effect of either a good or an inferior bull will have an enormous influence on the herd.

90% made up as follows:	Bull 1: 12.5%	(The contribution of the last three bulls
	Bull 2: 25%	is thus 87.5% in your current female herd)
	Bull 3: 50%	

Although a bull makes up only 3% to 5% of the herd, he is actually responsible for 50% of the genetic composition of every calf crop. His daughters are the future breeding herd.
